Training: She received her dental degree from SUNY Stony Brook, and her public health training at Harvard University. She was on the faculty at Harvard University, the University of Michigan, and the University of North Carolina prior to coming to UCSF in 1995. In 1998, she completed a USPHS Primary Care Policy Fellowship.

Department and Position: Lee Hysan Professor and Chair, Division of Oral Epidemiology and Dental Public Health, University of California, San Francisco, School of Dentistry. She is the Director of the multi-disciplinary NIH-funded Center to Address Disparities in Children's Oral Health based at UCSF.

Career Profile: Dr. Weintraub's research has focused on the epidemiology of oral conditions and caries prevention-oriented randomized clinical trials. Her patient and population-based research, with applications to dental patients or the larger community, spans the continuum of epidemiology, clinical research, health services research and health policy.

In addition to research, Dr. Weintraub has been involved with several health policy activities including development of the national Healthy People 2000 and 2010 oral health objectives. She was one of the scientific editors and contributing authors for the first Surgeon General's Report on Oral Health, and a member of the research panel for the ADA's Future of Dentistry Report. At UCSF, Jane has served as Chair of the campus-wide Graduate Council, the Chancellor's Advisory Committee on Disability Issues, and the School of Dentistry's Task Force on Women and Under-represented Minorities

She is a diplomate of the American Board of Dental Public Health and Past President of the American Association of Public Health Dentistry, the Behavioral Sciences and Health Services Research Group of the International Association of Dental Research, and the Stony Brook School of Dental Medicine Alumni Association.
