



## Sally J. Marshall, Ph.D.

**Training:** Dr. Marshall received her PhD in Materials Science and Engineering from Northwestern University.

**Department and Position:** She is Vice Provost, Academic Affairs and Director, Office of Faculty Development and Advancement and Professor of Biomaterials and Bioengineering, Department of Preventive and Restorative Dental Sciences, School of Dentistry

**Career Profile:** She began her faculty career in the Biological Materials Department at Northwestern University, moving to UCSF in 1987 as a Professor and Vice Chair for Research of her department.

Dr. Marshall is a member of the Graduate Group in Oral and Craniofacial Sciences and the UCSF-UCB Joint Graduate Group in Bioengineering. She is a Guest Staff Scientist at Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory. Dr. Marshall was appointed Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs in 2005. In addition to her administrative duties, she maintains a research program in biomaterials, with an emphasis on structure-property relationships in calcified tissues, especially teeth, and novel implant materials. She has been the principal investigator of an NIH program project grant for 16 years on dentin characterization and modification. She is a past president of her three major professional societies, including the International Association for Dental Research.

**Personal Profile:** Dr. Marshall is married to a UCSF faculty member, Grayson W Marshall, DDS, MPH, PhD, Professor and Vice Chair of the department of Preventive and Restorative Dental Sciences. They work together on research. They also have two sons, Trey and Jon, both of whom graduated from UC Berkeley in 2006.
