



## Elizabeth Ozer, Ph.D

**Training:** She earned her M.A. and Ph.D. at Stanford University, completed a Clinical Psychology Internship in the Dept. of Child Psychiatry at Stanford, and an NIMH post-doctoral fellowship in Health Psychology with a traineeship in Adolescent Medicine at the University of California, S.F.

**Department and Position:** Associate Professor of Pediatrics in the Division of Adolescent Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco. Director of Research, Young Adult and Family Center, Department of Psychiatry.

**Career Profile:** She is the Co-Director of Research Training for the Adolescent Medicine Fellowship Training; Director of Research for the Young Adult and Family Center within the Department of Psychiatry, and a faculty member within the Center for Health and Community. Dr. Ozer is a psychologist whose research experience has focused primarily on the health of adolescents and families. She has served as either Principal Investigator or Co-Principal Investigator of several U.S. federally funded grants to conduct large intervention studies on implementing and evaluating adolescent preventive services. This has included the development of primary care provider trainings and the integration of screening and charting tools to increase the screening and counseling of adolescents for risky behavior. Her work has moved beyond implementation of preventive services to examine the effects of delivering preventive services on adolescent risk behavior. A secondary area of research has been the development of self-efficacy and helping families to combine work and family roles.

Dr. Ozer has served on the Adolescent Advisory Group for the Foundation of Accountability and the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) to develop standardized measures for adolescent-relevant categories of quality of care; is Chair of the Preventive Services Special Interest Group for the Society for Adolescent Medicine; was a member of The Agency for Healthcare Research & Quality's Steering Committee on Translating Research into Practice; and is currently a member of the Chancellor's Committee on the Status of Women.

She has published in journals such as *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*, *Psychology of Women Quarterly*, *Women's Health: Research on Gender, Behavior, and Policy*, *Archives of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine*, *Pediatrics*, *Journal of Adolescent Health*, and *Health Services Research*.
