Training: She received her PhD in Social Psychology from Dartmouth in 1993. She came to UCSF as a postdoctoral fellow at the Center for AIDS Prevention Studies and received her MPH in epidemiology from Berkeley in 1994.

Career Profile: She studies the effects of positive affect on physical and psychological adjustment to chronic illness. She worked for a number of years as a project director and research specialist before becoming faculty in 2003 with the receipt of her first R01 regarding the adaptive functions of positive affect in people newly diagnosed with HIV. Other current and future projects include studies of positive affect in adjustment to other serious health events (pancreas cancer surgery, diagnosis of type 2 diabetes) and an intervention to increase positive affect in people newly diagnosed with HIV.
